In March 2020, Becky Copenhaver will host a wedding for over 150 people in the back garden of her Becky's Garden Shoppe in Punta Gorda, with a reception overlooking the Powell's Nursery pond.

"They wanted to do something a little more bohemian," said Copenhaver. "So they started looking at farm and barn weddings. What people were asking for those venues was just incredible. But because I know the family, and this is my first foray into this size thing, I just needed to get my feet wet."
